Beaufort County 250 Committee Historic Site Tours Bloody Point Beach – Daufuskie Island



Bloody Point is the site of multiple military conflicts in the Eighteenth Century.

The location of a lookout station prior to the Revolutionary War, it was the site of a 1715 battle between Beaufort District Militia and Yemassee warriors, giving the site its name.

In July of 1775, militia from Beaufort District departed from it in scout boats to intercept the armed British supply ship *Philippa*.

Following the British capture of Savannah, a British detachment garrisoned at Bloody Point was attacked by Patriot militia from Hilton Head island in the third Battle of Bloody Point.

The nearby Mary Dunn Cemetery is the resting place of leading Loyalists families from the Revolution.
